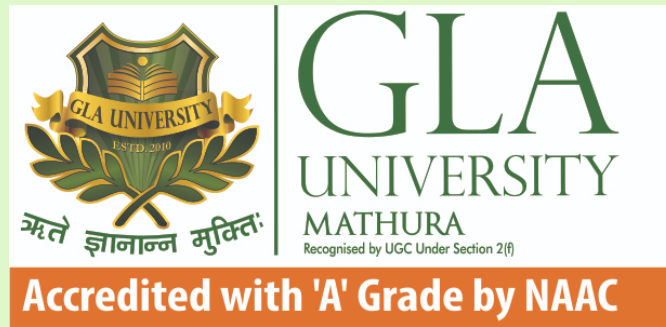

Instructions for question papers in end-semester evaluation for CC 1-14 and DSE 1-5

- Each of the honors' papers (CC I – 14) and DSE (1 – 5) the texts will be segregated into two different groups; Group A and Group B.
- Only 2 and 5 marks questions are to be set from texts in Group A and 10 marks questions are to be set from texts in Group B.
- In Group A, for 2 and 5 marks questions, at least one question must be set from each text/author.
- In Group B, at least one question carrying 10 marks is to be set from each text/author. In case more than one question is set from a text/author those questions should be offered as alternatives to each other.
- Ten (out of sixteen) questions carrying 2 marks each should be answered by students.
- Four (out of nine) questions carrying 5 marks each should be answered by students.
- Two (out of four) questions carrying 10 marks each should be answered by students.
